

Princeton Elm

Ulmus americana 'Princeton'

Description: A majestic deciduous (drops its leaves in the fall) and vase-shaped shade tree.

Mature height: 60' to 70' with a spread of 30' - 40'

Growth rate: Medium to fast

Foliage is green, turning yellow in the fall. Flowers are inconspicuous. Branches are upright and bark is brown.

Habitat: Hardy Range: 2 - 9

Soil: Clay, sand, loam; alkaline, acidic; well drained, extended flooding Salt tolerance: Medium

Exposure: Partial sun to full sun

Fun facts: This cultivar was introduced by Princeton Nurseries in 1922, it has proven itself to be resistant to Dutch Elm Disease. The fall yellow of this stately tree is truly magnificent.
